## Transfer Station

Acceptable Plastic Items List - The Single Stream Recyclable bin accepts only clean plastic items showing the recycling symbol #1 - #7. Each plastic item must show the recycling symbol. Only rinsed and clean #1 - #7, plastic tubs, plastic screw-top jars, plastic bottles and plastic jugs are acceptable.

Prohibited Plastic Items - all plastic items not on the Acceptable Plastic Items List. Any plastic items that are NOT #1 - #7, rinsed and clean, tubs, screw-top jars, bottles and jugs are prohibited. For example, plastic bags, plastic garbage bags, plastic food bags, blister-packs and plastic wraps (food, shipping, and bubble) are prohibited.

Please note that some store plastic bags have a recycling symbol but are prohibited in the Single Stream Recyclable bin. Some stores have a store plastic bag recycling bin for your convenience.





**New York City's 9/11 Memorial Museum Sunday, April 26, 2015**

### **The High Line' & Chelsea Marketplace**

Everyone remembers where they were on September 11<sup>th</sup>, 2001. On that date, the Twin Towers of the World Trade Center were destroyed in a terrorist attack that took the lives of almost 3,000 people. From the ashes of this tragedy has risen a memorial that New Yorkers and all Americans can be proud of – The National September 11 Memorial & Museum. On September 11<sup>th</sup>, 2011, the 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the attacks, the 9/11 Memorial was dedicated. Two beautiful waterfall pools are located on the sites of the Twin Towers. Around the edges of the pools are inscribed on bronze plates the names of the 2,977 victims killed on 9/11.

The long awaited 9/11 Memorial Museum was opened on May 21, 2014. Exhibits in this magnificent museum include 23,000 images, 10,300 artifacts and nearly 2,000 oral histories of the victims, lovingly remembered by friends and family members. A smashed and partially burned fire truck, used to rescue people from the WTC's North Tower is a prominent display on the lower level of the museum. "You won't walk out of this museum without a feeling that you understand humanity in a deeper way," said the museum's President.

We'll visit Chelsea Marketplace and New York's much talked about attraction, The High Line. Chelsea Marketplace is home to the Food Network, TV's most popular culinary channel. You never know what famous culinary celebrity you'll see at the marketplace. There are over 25 delicious choices of places to eat and browse, with everything from snacks to lobsters and gourmet gelato. Add two 'designer' bakeries, a well-stocked wine store and a cooking equipment emporium with every imaginable culinary tool, and you have New York City's 'Culinary Place to dine, browse and shop.'

'The High Line' is a 1.45 mile linear park, an elevated Greenway, inspired by the 3 mile Promenade Plantee, a similar project in Paris completed in 1993. The views of the New York skyline and Hudson River from this landscaped elevated walkway are truly breathtaking. There is an elevator just outside Chelsea Marketplace up to 'The High Line.'



