

## From the Desk of the First Selectman

We continue roadside mowing, sweeping, road repair and will continue these endeavors until the snow flies.

We also continue to look for ways and yes we are still in the running for help to work on the bottom part of Pautipaug Hill Road, and all of Grandview and Sunrise Drive, I certainly appreciate your patience during this grant process.

Along with this process we are seeking letters which illuminate the need for these road repairs, please forward your letters to my office as further demonstration of the urgency of this repair! I have received 2 letters for Sunrise Drive and I am looking for additional letters for Pautipaug Hill Rd and Grandview Drive.

These roads are the worst roads in town and in need of the most repairs. To put this in perspective the bottom portion of Pautipaug Hill Rd from Rte. 207 – LaCroix Rd is estimated to cost \$375 thousand dollars for construction alone. The entire road is expected to cost \$2 million dollars; this is exactly why the grants are so necessary. I apologize for the length of time this is taking.

On a lighter note the river has been stocked with salmon. Oh what a sight it is to sit outside the grist mill watching the bald eagles and egrets compete with the fishermen!

Thanks to Craig Staggs for a fun filled 3VFF it was simply a great day!


