

From the Desk of the First Selectman

I am breathing a sigh of relief at our budget for fiscal year 11/12 being passed last month --- thank you for getting out and voting --- it is our right, our obligation and our honor. A great deal of credit goes to the Board of Finance for the many nights (done voluntarily) that they spent deliberating in order to maintain necessary services at a reasonable rate. Thanks!

We are again preparing for a busy summer – with concerts, plays, river rides, and of course the 150th celebration coming up. Please watch the web, sign up for e-Sprague, and watch the news for upcoming events. Besides these fun events there is a summer recreation program being put on by the Park and Recreation Committee (contact Noreen Foley or Liz Calderon). And the library is hosting its Summer Reading program again – remember the top reader will be in next year’s Memorial Day parade!

Besides the joyful activities, there will be many road projects going on this year; we are hoping to start soon on School Hill Road followed shortly by Whitehall Drive and Birchwood Terrace. In addition, drainage work will be done on Potash Hill; this should complete the necessary drainage on this road. It will then be chip-sealed. We also plan on replacing the catch basins on the 207 side of Rose and Marion. An additional catch basin will be placed at the top of Parkwood Road which will also be chip sealed. Upper High Street should be done by the end of July and work will finally start on LaCroix Bridge.

We will be having a ribbon cutting and grand opening of our completely renovated Grist Mill – Stay tuned for the date! I know our very own Congresswoman Chase Going Woodhouse would be thrilled that we have saved this gorgeous piece of our history.

I do have some very serious news to pass along --- over the last few months we here in Town as well as the surrounding areas have been subjected to a few burglaries. These have occurred mostly during the day when people are at work or out shopping. I am asking you to make sure you are locking your doors and also I am asking that we all pay attention to our neighbor’s property – if you see something out of the ordinary, please call 911. I stress that you call 911 because our Resident Trooper is often on the road and not in the office. Calling 911 is the quickest way to have someone respond to address concerns. 911 should be used whenever an immediate response is necessary. If anyone has noticed something out of the ordinary over the last few weeks, please call Trooper Randy Silvestri here at the Town Hall (860-822-3000 x 207).

In addition there have been instances of graffiti and general disrespect of property at the skateboard park area. This is a well used park which many enjoy. It is the responsibility of the users to keep this area clean; free of litter, free of graffiti so that all may enjoy this area. Sadly if this is not kept clean, the park will be closed for the summer. If you have information on abuses at the park, call Trooper Silvestri.

Tax Collector's Office

The first installment of Real Estate and Personal Property taxes will become due and payable on July 1, 2011. Motor Vehicle tax bills will also become due and payable on July 1, 2011. You will have the entire month of July to pay your taxes. Taxes unpaid as of August 1, 2011 will become delinquent and will be subject to 3% interest, from then on additional interest of 1 ½% per month (18% annually) will be charged. Minimum interest is \$2.00.

Please make checks payable to Town of Sprague. You may pay all bills – Real Estate, Personal Property, and Motor Vehicles with one check. If you pay by mail and would like a receipt, please mail entire tax bill and a self-addressed, stamped envelope with your payment. Taxpayers needing an immediate clearance for the registration of a delinquent motor vehicle must pay by cash, money order, or certified check.

If you have any questions regarding your tax bill, you may call the tax collector at 822-3000, ext. 224. Any questions regarding address changes, assessments, exemptions, or your correct tax town should be directed to the Assessor at 822-3000, ext. 222.

Fireworks during the Fourth of July are as American as apple-pie, but did you know that more fires are reported on that day than on any other day of the year in the United States? Nearly half of these fires are caused by fireworks. The good news is you can enjoy your holiday and the fireworks, with just a few simple safety tips:

PROCEED WITH CAUTION!

- ❑ Leave fireworks to the professionals.
Do not use consumer fireworks.
- ❑ The safest way to enjoy fireworks is to attend a public display conducted by trained professionals.
- ❑ After the firework display, children should never pick up fireworks that may be left over, they may still be active.

How **HOT** does a Sparkler burn?

CONSUMER FIREWORKS

include sparklers and firecrackers. The tip of a sparkler burns at a temperature of more than **1,800 degrees Fahrenheit**, which is hot enough to cause third-degree burns.

FACTS

Each year Americans spend 201 million dollars on fireworks. We cause 20 million dollars worth of property loss and 7,000 people have to go to the emergency room. Here are some tips to keep you safe during the holiday season.

- * **Alcohol and fireworks do not mix**
- * **Sparklers reach temperatures up to 1800 degrees - do not touch the lit portion**
- * **If the sparklers explode or fly, they're most likely illegal - don't use them**
